We congratulate all those selected and hope they can play well and help Western Province win some gold medals.

On the question of selection for major honours an ex member of ours **Sylvia Burns** was selected by Bowls South Africa to represent her country in the World Bowls tournament held in Christchurch, New Zealand last November. The team as a whole did not do very well but the Ladies Trips, with her colleagues Elma Davis & Susan Nel, won the bronze medal winning 7 of their 9 round-robin matches which got them into the quarter final. There they beat Scotland 18-17 but narrowly lost in the semi-final to Australia 15-17. Australia went on to win the final by a wide margin. Sadly, this bronze was South Africa's only medal at this event. I am indebted to Inga Freddi for drawing my attention to this achievement.

SPEC-SAVERS: BOWLS SA PRO 10 PAIRS.

It is with regret that we advise the discontinuance and removal of the above event from our national calendar.

Our sponsor namely, Spec-Savers, has withdrawn their financial support after carefully monitoring their reciprocal business and support emanating through their stores from bowlers. We wish to thank Spec-Savers for their support over a number of years and fully understand their position.

It is not financially possible for Bowls SA to continue with this event and Districts are requested to inform their clubs accordingly.

This is a message to all bowlers from WP Bowling Association:

International Blind Bowls Tournament in South Africa 20th to 28th March 2017

The above tournament will be held at WPCC from Monday 20th March 2017 to the final round on the morning of 28th March 2017 followed by the prize giving.

The tournament takes place straight after the Inter-districts tournament and practise the week before commencement has been arranged with various clubs in the district.

Players will be participating from Australia, Canada, England, Hong Kong, Israel, New Zealand, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales and of course South Africa.

The formats of play are singles – men and ladies (mornings) and pairs - mixed (afternoons) and will take place on a round-robin basis in four categories being B1, B2, B3 and B4. Bowlers are categorised according to the 'level' of blindness with B1 being totally blind. Each bowler will play with a director who will communicate with the marker (in a singles game) and the other player (and his/her director) in the case of the pairs.

It promises to be very enlightening experience for spectators and officials.

Such a tournament cannot take place without a tremendous amount of support and assistance from the local bowling community. To this end, we require the assistance of markers and umpires for each day of play (Monday 20th – Friday 24th) and Monday 27th. The biggest requirement is for markers (around 20 each morning).

Mike Connolly of WPCC will be co-ordinating all technical official requirements and volunteers. Please, if you are able to volunteer your assistance on any of these days of play, would you e-mail him with your availability at mconnolly@telkomsa.net also stating your 'qualifications' to umpire or mark. For markers, anyone who is fully familiar with the duties of the marker, has played/marked in the singles format before will be able to assist. Umpires will need the required qualifications.

MESSAGE FROM TERRY HEPWORTH ON BEHALF OF HIS GREENS COMMITTEE

ARRANGEMENTS AND COMMUNICATION REGARDING GREENS PREPARATION

We wish to bring to your attention the following arrangements and procedures which have been discussed by Exco.

Practice facilities

1. Where possible, two greens will be made available for skills and squad training on Tuesday and Thursday evenings.
2. Should a second green not be available on one of these evenings, due to unscheduled repair activities, the Greens Committee will inform those running the training programmes timeously.

3. Unfortunately, the extreme heat at the moment plus our fertilising programme requires us to water the greens on a Thursday, particularly after the previous day's WP Midweek games. This watering will take place early in the morning so as not to affect the speed too adversely.
4. The A green will not always be one of the greens available for practice.
5. We will continue to consult team captains regarding the condition of the greens but cannot guarantee that Thursday's speed will be exactly replicated on the Saturday.

Club competitions

6. Where competitions are carded for a Sunday, it is not our policy to bring in staff to cut the green.
7. However, where the Competition Secretaries feel the status of the match deserves it, (Singles/Pairs semis and finals), they will arrange with the Greens Committee for the green to be specially prepared.

Friday afternoons

8. There will normally be two greens available for Development, Barefoot Bowls, Tabs and practice on a Friday afternoon.
9. Where a green is taken up by an outside organisation (Corporate Bowls), the members will be notified in advance.

Bookings

10. Bookings should be entered into the Diary during the week preceding the requirement, preferably before the weekend.
11. The maintenance programme for the week is drawn up on a Sunday evening, having taken bookings in the Diary into account.
12. Any special requests such as rinks for bounce games, club competitions, practice matches or barefoot bowls, which are made after the start of the week should be communicated directly to Terry.
13. Merely writing in the diary the need for a rink or two for a bounce game, club competition, practice match or barefoot bowls will not guarantee that it will be noticed and the required preparation taken place.
14. Having said that, having three greens does allow us quite a bit of flexibility in arranging additional games.
15. Players are encouraged to read the Greens Committees daily notes on the whiteboard at the Club entrance.

SOCIAL LEAGUE

Six teams are participating in this Trips competition which commenced two Saturdays back and will continue for another 5 weeks (at least!). This is open to all members not involved in other Club commitments. Please give Terry a shout if you would like to be included.

Sponsorship
