Heather Cawood has volunteered to run a quiz evening at the Club on Friday 13th May 2016, to start at 18h30 with team registration and the quiz itself to start 19h00. The basic format would be as follows:

- Teams of 4 players with an entry fee of R25 per person to cover the prizes.
- Each team to select a name to go onto the leader board
- Each team to pre-select a category as their bonus round where points are doubled.

- The topics covered are General Knowledge, Sport, Music, and Entertainment with 2 x “speciality rounds” based on General Knowledge and/or Music
- There will be a 30 minute break halfway through the quiz so it might be expedient to pre-order drinks.

These evenings take a lot of effort to organise so I hope as many members as possible support the trouble Heather is taking on our behalf.

A rota could be set up at the start of each event to cover the whole tournament where members (in particular those members who are unable to volunteer for other tasks that help the Club) are asked to carry out this simple operation.

Whilst we wait for City of Cape Town to carry out their promise/obligation to replace our roof your Exco have decided that we must try and protect the bar and kitchen areas now from water ingress and so a contractor has been appointed to effect repairs to these two critical areas of the roof. Work is expected to start this Month.

We have purchased 14 new mats that brings our total to 36, which covers us for all three greens.

We regret to advise that one of our Life Members **Ian Swanepol**, passed away at the end of March. He had been suffering from dementia for many years and has not been seen at the Club for quite some time

During his years of good health Ian was a great supporter of the Club and entered most Club Competitions and was a regular Tabs In Player.

In the 1980's the Club was in dire need of funds for development and various schemes were introduced to raise money. One of the projects was that a member could purchase Life Membership and that entitled the member to be exempt from future annual subscriptions. The amount to be paid was calculated at 10 times the annual subs. Ian was one of 3 of our members who took up the offer and always said it was one of the best investments He had made.

After his higher education he followed his parents in the Hotel Industry and at one time was the owner of the successful Bloemfontein Hotel

To those very few members that remember Ian will recall him as being a quite confident and polite gentleman May he now Rest In Peace.

Format: Trips over 18 ends, with the players changing position every 6 ends. Each player will get the opportunity to play at Skip, Third and Lead during the game

Teams: Men, women, or mixed. Only one club-graded Skip per team. Individuals, not part of a team, will be accommodated in a team on the day.

Dates: Tuesday mornings, starting 12 April 2016, and running over 8 weeks.

Scoring: The individual player will take the team score each week. The individual's **four best scores** over the 8-week period will be taken into account when determining the winners. This is important. It means that you don't have to commit yourself for all eight weeks and will not be penalised by missing the occasional Tuesday morning.

Entry: Teams of three: Constantia Club members to enter their teams on the list in the Clubhouse by the Friday preceding the Tuesday bowls.
Other Clubs: can enter teams by contacting Terry Hepworth (0732671751) or Peter Brown (021 7611087) by the Friday preceding each Tuesday.

Individual players; should arrive at Constantia no later than 08h45 to be placed in a team.

The weekly entry fee of R25 per player includes tea...

Prizes: There will be weekly session prizes (R240 per team) for the best score.

At the end of the 8 weeks, prizes, based on the best four scores over 8 weeks, will be awarded as follows:
