B Green is taking strain, but we can only close it when A Green comes into play. **C Green** will be the last to close, probably mid-November. This means that we will only have two greens in operation until the New Year.

We are building up the height of the **banks** on C Green. We are grateful to players for avoiding placing their bags, bowls or feet on the built up banks. Please share this with visiting bowlers.

Sundowner time: On Wednesday and Saturday afternoons, and Sunday mornings, no members of the Greens staff are present to tidy up. We would appreciate it if members could continue to bring in the trolleys and

either leave them on the veranda or, better still, take them through to the Rest Room.

Practice: From the beginning of the new season (October onwards) we intend to institute a system of allocating rinks for practice or bounce games. This is part of our programme of changing rink markers and directions of play to avoid compaction and wear and tear.

Utilisation: Each year we remind our members that our greens are hopelessly underutilised. Even taking Mondays, Friday mornings and Sunday afternoons out of the equation, our utilisation of greens this past year will be just over 10%. This includes WP competitions.

We would encourage members to arrange bounce games or practice matches. The only stipulation from our side is that these games be entered in the Diary in good time.
