In the previous Falcon, we mentioned that the average cost of maintaining one green, was in the region of R120 000. One or two members reacted to this by suggesting that perhaps we should consider closing down one of our greens.

It may well turn out one day that C green becomes a croquet court/ putting green/mini soccer field/parking lot etc. However, in the meantime we need to assure members that economies of scale prevail as far as our greens expenses are concerned. In other words, R120 000 per green does not translate into R360 000 per year for us. Our costs are significantly lower.

## **Lateral thinking**

Membership of Bowling Clubs is diminishing right across the District. Further complicating the issue is that the City Council is reviewing lease agreements, with murmurs that market-related rentals may have to be introduced. In order to remain viable, Clubs are having to come up with alternative ways in which their facilities can be used in order to generate additional funds.
