COMMUNICATION

It has emerged during the recent series of Greens Inspections that a number of Greenkeepers have not been receiving our monthly newsletters. Apart from sharing information regarding good greenkeeping practices in these newsletters, we also used this forum to indicate to Clubs how to prepare for the inspections. Among other things, it asked for a levels profile according to the Cubitt programme, as well as suggesting that GKPs carry out their own evaluation of their greens prior to the visit. It was apparent that this information did not filter through to some of the GKPs. In future, these monthly newsletters will be sent directly to the GKP.

NEMATODES

In the past we have recommended that Clubs send soil samples to Nemlab to determine the presence of nematodes in their greens. These microscopic animals attack the roots, drawing off the nutrition from the plant. In this way they stunt the development of the plant, resulting in yellow, stressed areas. If these areas do not respond to the usual treatment of fungicides, fertilisers and rest, you've probably got nematodes.

Nematodes (eel worms) can be treated with Furfural (Cropguard) if the concentration is within limits. However, one of our Clubs has recently had their soil tested with the results showing an exceptionally high presence of nematodes. It is doubtful whether Furfural will be effective with such a high concentration. They may have to consider taking even more drastic action. Prevention is better than cure, so we seriously recommend that you have your greens tested. Contact Sheila Storey at Nemlab (sheila@nemlab.co.za)

LEVELS

At the end of the annual renovation period when it is necessary to apply the computer readings to improve the levels, a few Clubs have, in the past, made use of the laser-levelling process.
