### **ANNUAL RENOVATION OF GREENS**

### **LAWNTYL**

Some of us have elected to use Lawntyl, instead of Kerb, to eradicate winter grass. There have been mixed results. One should note that some suppliers of the product state clearly that the product "is not for use on bowling greens". While we would welcome feedback from any GKPs who have used the product, we would draw your attention to the precautions which state that Lawntyl should be applied on grass that "has not been cut for at least five days", should be left for a few days and then watered in. Applying it to young, recently mown or stressed Bayview is likely to end in disaster.

## **ANNUAL GREENS INSPECTIONS**

These have been completed and we thank the GKPs and their staff for their cooperation. We are still waiting for certain Clubs to provide us with their "Cubitt levels" before we can finalise the Merit List.
